# NATIONAL WORKSHOP ON THE RATIFICATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE BBNJ AGREEMENT AND SCOPING FOR TUVALU NATIONAL OCEAN POLICY































#### **Concept Note**

National Workshop on the Ratification and Implementation of the Agreement under United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea on the Conservation and Sustainable Use of Marine Biological Diversity Beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ Agreement).

Held at the Rt Hon Dr Sir Tomasi Puapua Convention Centre from 20<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> of January 2025.

#### **Purpose**

This 3-day workshop will bring together the relevant stakeholders in Tuvalu, to prepare for the ratification, domestication, and implementation of the BBNJ Agreement. Tuvalu signed the Agreement on 20 September 2023, on the margins of the 78th Session of the United Nations General Assembly, High – Level Week in New York.

The workshop aims to serve as a familiarization exercise for national agencies, ensuring that all relevant stakeholders are aware of their respective roles and responsibilities under the BBNJ Agreement. It will also provide an overview of existing national legislation/regulations/policies that are relevant for the effective implementation of the BBNJ Agreement.

The workshop is organized in partnership between the Tuvalu Government and the Office of the Pacific Ocean Commissioner, in close collaboration with regional and global partners.

#### **Background**

In its resolution 72/249 of 24 December 2017, the General Assembly decided to convene an Intergovernmental Conference, under the auspices of the United Nations, to consider the recommendation of the Preparatory Committee established by resolution 69/292 of 19 June 2015 on the elements to elaborate the text of an international legally binding instrument under UNCLOS on the conservation and sustainable use of marine biological diversity of areas beyond national jurisdiction, with a view of developing an instrument as soon as possible.

The United Nations convened a total of five Intergovernmental Conferences (IGCs), two in 2019, one in 2020, one in 2021, one in 2022 and two resumed sessions in 2023. The resumed IGC5 session in March of 2023 concluded the BBNJ negotiations. The finalized BBNJ Agreement was later adopted by UN Member States on 19 June 2023.

#### **Objectives**

The key objectives of this workshop are:

• Prepare for the ratification and implementation of the BBNJ Agreement, in accordance with relevant national processes.

- Provide stakeholders with an understanding of the outcomes of the IGC5 negotiations and the adopted BBNJ Agreement;
- Provide stakeholders with an understanding of the linkage of the Agreement to national and regional oceans governance;
- Familiarize the stakeholders with the BBNJ Agreement and its linkage to their respective Ministry mandates; and
- Raise awareness and strengthen coordination between stakeholders, key partners, NGOs, and CSOs.

## **Meeting Format**

The workshop will be conducted in-person at the Rt Hon Dr Sir Tomasi Puapua Convention Centre from 20<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> of January 2025.
