

OPOC Mandate

At the Forty-First (41st) Session¹ of the Pacific Islands Forum in Vanuatu, Leaders endorsed the Framework for Pacific Oceanscape² (para 68) containing two specific action areas (2A and 2B), relevant to Office of the Pacific Ocean Commissioner (0POC). They pertain to: (i) the inception of the 0POC as a dedicated professional support unit to the Pacific Ocean Commissioner (appointed by Forum Leaders); and, (ii) the establishment of the Pacific Ocean Alliance as a multi-stakeholder mechanism that would provide effective ocean policy coordination and implementation, and facilitated by the Pacific Ocean Commissioner.

Since July 2018, OPOC has received financial support from partners, including Forum members Australia, French Polynesia and New Zealand, to fund staff and some activities of the OPOC. OPOC currently comprises of four full-time staff positions, being: 1) OPOC Manager and Ocean Analyst; 2) Ocean Management Officer; 3) Ocean Communications Officer; and, 4) OPOC Adviser on UN Ocean Issues.

OPOC's main work themes for the period 2017 - 2020 are to:

- Provide support to the Pacific Ocean Commissioner for advocacy at all levels - on important ocean issues for the region;
- Promote improved coordination on ocean issues across the region, particularly on new and emerging issues or those issues that require an inclusive and multi-stakeholder approach:
- Support effective engagement of Pacific Island Countries in UN negotiations on Biodiversity Beyond National Jurisdiction (BBNJ); and,
- Support development of ocean finance work in the region, including catalysing efforts and resources for the implementation of regional and global ocean policies and priority commitments.
